Virtual programming for the students

- Telus has several options for Science in Motion virtual learning this year, Winter themed program would be available to the whole school in half hour daily sessions for a week as well as additional programs of interest about Weather, Simple Machines, Rocks and Minerals for individual classes, which are 4 sessions each. Total cost for all programs \$1025
- o Earth Rangers Animal Ambassador program (JES on waiting list) Cost appears to be by donation
- SK Interactive Interactive Video Dance program, workshops include 5 approximately 30 min. sessions for up to 500 students, cost \$349
