Did you know about the DELF exam?

Jasper High School French immersion students take their Language Proficiency Assessment in grades 9, 10 or 11. It's called the DELF exam. After passing it, students receive an official diploma which is a life-long certification recognized internationally by employers and postsecondary institutions.
