Variant COVID-19	 You are legally required to quarantine for 14 days from the time you were exposed and monitor for symptoms if you are a close contact of a person who tested positive for variant COVID-19. You should get tested if you are a close contact of a confirmed case of variant COVID-19. Book a first test as soon as you receive confirmation that you are a close contact of someone who tested positive for the variant COVID 19. Book a second test 10 days or later after your last exposure to the confirmed variant COVID 19 case. It is strongly recommended that immediate household members of close contacts of variant COVID-19 cases also quarantine until the close contact receives a negative COVID-19 test result on or after 10 days from the exposure date or their 14 day quarantine is over, whichever is sooner.
Variant Close Contact	 For household close contacts living with a confirmed variant COVID-19 case: Even if the case can isolate at home in a separate room with access to a separate bathroom, this is may not be enough to prevent transmission to other members of the household. Every day the case is isolating at home is considered a new exposure to the household contacts.





	 Household contacts of variant cases must quarantine during the case's isolation period (10 days) plus an additional 14 days after the case's isolation period ends: 24 days in total. Call 211 if you need to access isolation hotels.

Variant COVID 19 Isolation	 AHS will call you if you are confirmed to be positive for a variant strain of COVID-19.
	 Isolating in the same household is not considered adequate to prevent transmission of variant COVID-19 to other people in the household.
	 If you are confirmed to have a case of variant COVID-19, you should isolate in a different location if possible, such as an isolation hotel.
	 If the case is a child, consider moving other family members not required for child care to a hotel for their quarantine period.
	 Call 211 if you need to access isolation hotels.

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	 Albertans are legally required to: isolate for 10 days if they have <u>any core symptoms</u> that are not related to a pre-existing illness or health condition quarantine for 14 days if they are a close contact of someone with COVID-19 or if they travelled outside Canada
Variant Isolation	 Variant COVID-19 AHS will call you if you are confirmed to be positive for a variant strain of COVID-19. Isolating in the same household is not considered adequate to prevent transmission of variant COVID-19 to other people in the household. If you are confirmed to have a case of variant COVID-19, you should isolate in a different location if possible, such as an isolation hotel. What about siblings?	 If a sibling is not sick or showing symptoms of COVID 19, they can attend school. They only need to isolate if they have come into close contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID. As per AHS, students do not have to isolate if: they are awaiting asymptomatic test results they have no symptoms of illness





	 they have symptoms of illness that are related to a pre-existing illness or health condition

Will my child have to wear a mask at school?	Public Health Order 33-2020 Mask Requirements in School
	Masks are mandatory for staff and teachers in all settings where physical distancing cannot be maintained.
	Students in Grades 4-12 will be required to wear masks in all shared and common areas such as hallways and on buses.
	Teachers may use their discretion to allow students to remove their masks when seated in the classroom.
	Exemptions will be made for students and staff who are unable to wear a mask due to medical or other needs.
	The province will provide two reusable masks to every GYPSD student and staff member.
	Mask use for kindergarten to Grade 3 students is optional as of August 14, 2020.
What is the illness policy for staff and students?	Students and staff must assess their health daily via the <u>screening</u> <u>questionnaire</u> .
	If they feel ill, they must stay home, and take the <u>AHS Online Self-</u> <u>Assessment tool</u> to determine if they should be tested.
What happens if my child's teacher gets sick?	If a teacher must stay home, a substitute teacher will be assigned for the class.
	Any staff member who feels ill must take the <u>AHS Online Self-</u> <u>Assessment tool</u> to determine if they need to book a COVID test.
Will a school be closed if there is a positive	The decision to send a cohort/class home or the recommendation to close a school will be made by the local Medical Officer of Health .
COVID-19 test at a school?	A COVID-19 case will not automatically lead to school closure.
	Students and staff will be supported to learn or work from home if they are required to remain at home due to a school, cohort, or class closure.

	GYPSD is also reinforcing respiratory etiquette , which includes covering the mouth and nose during coughing or sneezing with a tissue or a flexed elbow and disposing of used tissues in a plastic-lined waste container, followed by hand hygiene.
How will GYPSD prevent the transmission of COVID-19 at school?	There is no way to completely prevent transmission, but many health measures are in place in schools to minimize the possibility of transmission within schools:
	 <u>Daily health checklist</u> – if students or staff feel ill, they must stay home. Anyone who reports symptoms must seek health care advice as appropriate and fill out the AHS Online Self-Assessment tool to determine if they should be tested
	 Keeping groups of students and staff together and assigning seating in classrooms and on buses to decrease the number of close contacts (referred to as cohorting)
	 Directional signage in high-traffic areas
	 Emphasis upon hand hygiene, including frequent hand washing
	 Respiratory etiquette such as covering coughs and sneezes
	 More frequent cleaning of high-touch surfaces like desks, chairs, door handles and stair railings
	 Encouraging students to bring refillable water bottles, rather than drinking directly from water fountains





	 Staggering lunch and recess times to reduce congestion at peak times
	 Physically distancing wherever possible
How can students physically distance while at school or on	It is not possible to maintain a two metre or six-foot distance at all times while in school or on the bus.
the school bus?	However, measures will be in place to reduce direct contact with others. While in classrooms or on buses, students will have assigned seating. Lunch and recess times will be staggered to mitigate congestion. Signs will be in place to remind students and staff to physically distance wherever possible.
	As outlined in the Alberta Guidance for School Re-Entry in situations where physical distancing is not possible, extra emphasis on masks, hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette, not participating when sick, and cleaning and disinfecting on a regular basis.
What if my child has COVID-19 like symptoms at school?	If your child begins to feel sick at school, they will be taken to a supervised infirmary room or designated isolated space and given a disposable mask to wear.
	Parents/guardians will be contacted and must pick their child up within the hour. If a parent/guardian cannot be reached, emergency contacts will be notified.
	Parents will be required to have their child(ren) tested for COVID-19.
Will I know if there is a positive case at my school?	AHS will notify parents if their child may have been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19 at school, and public health officials will contact those who were in close contact with the person.
How will students physically distance on a bus?	The Division will only transport eligible students during the 2020/2021 school year.
	Because physical distancing cannot be maintained on a bus, the focus will be on cleaning and health measures, including the use of masks where possible.





	There will be an assigned seating plan. Cohorting of siblings on buses will only occur where siblings are on the same route.
What should parents and students do before	Parents must complete the screening tool with their children.
leaving home for the bus stop?	All students who experience symptoms must stay home.
	Parents and students must not be in the pickup area or enter the bus if they have symptoms of COVID-19.
If my child gets sick	No.
while at school, can they take the bus home?	Parents or guardians must pick up their child if they get sick while at school. Parents must designate an emergency contact in case they are unable to pick up their child within the hour.
	Please ensure your school has current emergency contact information.
What happens if a child displays COVID-19	The student will be assigned a seat at the front of the bus, with no other students, and given a mask.
symptoms while at the bus stop and no parent / caregiver is present?	Parents/guardians must pick their child up at school as soon as possible.
Are there at-home	No.
learning options for junior kindergarten and/or kindergarten?	Kindergarten education in Alberta is not mandatory. Early Learning and Kindergarten programs are play-based and focused on socialization. Kindergarten students have the option for on-site learning or to start school in Grade 1.
Are there at-home	Yes. French language conversation supports are available.
learning supports for French Immersion?	Please discuss with your school principal.
How will teachers support students due to the disruption in	Teachers know that some students may need more support to address gaps from the spring and will design learning tasks accordingly.
learning that occurred last spring when learning at home?	Teachers will construct lessons and assessment opportunities based on students' current level of achievement.





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
