## Looking Ahead at the 2021-2022 School Year

Our projected enrolment for the 2021/2022 school year is 244 students from Kindergarten to grade six. Our budget for next year will remain very similar to the 2020/2021 school year. Staffing numbers will increase by 0.7 to 12.5 full-time teaching staff. Our support staff funding remains similar at 7.5 positions for JES. Ninety

percent of the budget is allocated to staffing expenses. We are pleased to report that we will not be laying off any staff in the next school year. However, the Equalization Grant (\$82,295.00) received for the 2020/2021 school year will be phased out and this year we have a reduction to (\$55 318) which may result in a reduction of staff in future years if we do not receive any replacement grants.

### 2. Trustee's Report

This month the board met with high school student representatives to discuss issues including mental health supports and anti-racism. At the recent board meeting results of the Alberta Education Assurance Survey were reviewed and the Superintendent discussed work being done on redesign and piloting of a common report card across the division. Public school board association meeting is coming up, there will be the opportunity for some school council representatives to attend.
